



MINUTES
Suring Sportsman's Club
Wednesday, August 31, 2022

1. The meeting was called to order by President Bill Madison.

4. Old business:

 - Ethel Firgens thanked the SSC for a wonderful day with her Grandchildren and her Great Grandchildren. She was tickled pink to see her great grandson on the flyers and posters. We also received a wonderful handwritten Thank You card for the gift certificate they won, from S. Bristol!
 - Don, Carol, and Jay got the bow range turned around. The new bench for the bow range arrived and needs to be re-arranged and stake out the distances for the bow range. It was donated by Gary Hischke.
 - The new bow range 3D targets (a deer, a bear, and a turkey) will not be available until December 2022.
5. New Business:
 - Bill and Jay Tousey (via phone) suggested removing the registration limit for future Youth Outdoor Fun Days. After discussion, Kurt Bruegl made a motion to accept removing the limit on registration. Christopher Jonet seconded the motion. The motion carried.
 - Bill suggested that we make a list of everything needed for next year's Youth Outdoor Fun Day, so we can acquire and do what's needed early.

 - Don Trester called for a motion for the club to make Gary Hischke a Life Member in recognition of all that he contributed to the club. Christopher Jonet moved to do so, and Kurt Bruegl seconded the motion. Bill called for a vote and the motion carried.
 - Gary Hischke brought up the club's need for a pair of .22 revolvers to be used for future Youth Outdoor Fun Days as we ended up scrambling around to find a pair for the Oconto County Deputies to instruct the kids on shooting. After discussion, it was decided that Ruger Blackhawk/Wrangler revolvers would be preferred. Gary made a motion for the club to purchase the firearms. Don Trester seconded the motion. Bill called for a vote and the motion carried.
 - Christopher Jonet of Kinetic Archery & Arms let us know that the Suring Sportsman's Club will be closed on Saturday, September 24 from 7:00 A.M. for a basic firearms class that he will be teaching.
6. Future Business:
