

MINUTES Suring Sportsman's Club Wednesday, May 28, 2025

- 1. The meeting was called to order by President Jay Tousey. Jay told us he became involved with the Suring Sportsman's Club when George Shank was the President; how the property was acquired and that the club was able to pay for it in 3 payments; and that the pheasant pens were built by club members.
- 2. Jay T. called for the minutes of the April 30, 2025, meeting to be read. Leigh Dudenhoeffer read the minutes. Gary Hischke made the note that the flag pole light was repaired by Krueger Electric and it works well. Jay T. called for a motion to accept the minutes as updated. Tony Gauthier made the motion and Kurt Bruegl seconded. Jay called for a vote and the motion carried.
- 3. Kurt Bruegl read the Treasurer's report for May 2025. Jay called for a motion to accept the treasurer's report as read. Gary H. made the motion and Tony G. seconded. Jay T. called for a vote and the motion carried.

4. Old Business:

- Representative Jeff Mursau gave our club a very nice, brand new Wisconsin State flag for our flag pole.
- No one showed up for the cleanup day. Hopefully, we have a better turnout next time we schedule it. We would like to have a couple of kids come and rake up the brass from the range.

5. New Business:

- The 1st Annual Sausage Shoot (June 21, 2025) planning is nearly completed. We need 10 people to volunteer for cooking, cleanup, etc. We need some large black poster board.
 - i. The rules are that only one round of 5 shots may be fired by each participant in line before they move to the end of the line for their 2nd (etc.) round(s) of 5 shots.
 - ii. The cost to shoot is \$1 for 5 shots.
 - iii. The tickets will be collected before each person shoots.
 - iv. All youth under the age of 18 need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian.
 - v. Burgers and brats will be available for \$4 each; soda and water will be \$1 each.
 - vi. A Sausage coupon will be given to each winner who shoots and breaks the string.
- We've been distributing posters and you're welcome to download and print posters to share from our website and facebook page.
- The firearm instruction portion of Hunters' Safety will be held at the Suring Sportsman's Club grounds on July 3, 2025. The club will be closed for this event.

- The Bow range road is going to be repaired where the road is worn down. We discussed moving the bow stand in its current place because it seems to be working well. Don Trestor suggested we install some cross bow targets. Mark Zahn suggested the big High Roller or Reinhardt targets. Jay T. called for a motion to get 2 targets and install them. Kurt Bruegl moved and Tony G. seconded. The motion carried.
- The fence by the rifle range has been fixed. We still need more 6-foot T-posts for both the rifle range and the pistol range. The post at the 25 yard range of the rifle range needs to be replaced.
- The pheasant pen will be cleaned out so we can work on the fence posts which will be replaced and/or repaired. We want to have this all cleaned up before this year's Youth Outdoor Fun Day.
- As we're working on updating our bylaws over the next couple of months, Jay proposed to change the club meeting time from 7:00 P.M. to 6:30 P.M., which passed unanimously after a vote was called for. This change will be added to the new bylaws.
- Our new shed was discussed. It will be 16 ft long and 12 ft wide with an overhead door with a concrete slab measuring 21 ft. long and 12 ft wide, which includes a 5 ft apron in front of the overhead door. After reviewing the estimates we acquired, Jay called for a vote to have Custom Exteriors of Suring, WI to build this for our club. Gary Hischke made motion a motion to accept the estimate. Tony Gauthier seconded the motion. Jay called for a vote and the motion carried unanimously.
- Jay called for motion to adjourn. Tony G. made the motion. Kurt B. seconded the motion. Jay called for a vote and the motion carried.
