

2026 BYLAWS of the SURING SPORTSMAN'S CLUB, Suring, WI

Article I – Name of the organization

The name of this organization is "Suring Sportsman's Club".

Article II – Purpose

Section 1 – The purpose of this not-for-profit (501c3/c7) organization is to promote and encourage organized firearm shooting and archery among our members, residents of our community, and U.S. citizens who may visit our club; while developing better knowledge, handling, and proper care of firearms as well as archery mastery and maintenance. It shall lead to improved marksmanship with the further object and purpose to the development of the characteristics of honesty, self-discipline, fellowship, community, and self-reliance which are the essentials of good sportsmanship and patriotism.

Article III – Membership

Any citizen of the U.S. who is 18 years of age or older may become a member of this club. Children under 18 years old must be accompanied by their parent(s) or guardian(s) while using our ranges. All are encouraged to become members of our club.

Article IV – Membership Dues

- (a) The member's annual membership dues to the club shall be \$20.
- (b) Memberships may be purchased at any time during the current fiscal year and can be acquired at these places:
 - a. Laverne & Gail's Restaurant – 314 E. Main St (Hwy 32), Suring, WI
 - b. Suring Auto & Hardware, Inc. 223 Heasley Street, Suring, WI
 - c. The Suring Barbershop, 704 E. Main St (Hwy 32), Suring, WI
 - d. The Suring BP, 822 Main St (Hwy 32), Suring, WI
 - e. Purchase one at a monthly meeting of the club, at the clubhouse.

Article V – Meetings

All members who are 18 years of age or older may vote at meetings. Everyone of all ages are welcome to attend our regular meetings.

- (a) Regular Meetings. The regular business meeting of the club for the transaction of ordinary business shall be held on the last Wednesday of every month at 6:30 P.M. at the clubhouse.

- (b) Board Meeting/Special Meeting. A special meeting of the club board may be held at any time upon the call of the President or the call of a member of the Executive committee. Likewise, an annual internal treasury audit shall be conducted yearly by the board / executive committee. Notice of the time, place, and object of any special meeting shall be given to all officers/members either at a regular meeting or via email or text message, not less than 7 days prior to the date fixed for the meeting.
- (c) Quorum. A quorum for voting shall consist of two-thirds of the members present at any club meeting.

Article VI – Officers

- (a) The officers of this club shall be a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, Range Officer and/or an Executive Officer who, acting together, shall constitute the Executive Committee. They shall be elected by a majority vote by the members in good standing present at the first meeting of each year of the club.
- (b) The officers shall hold office for one year or until their successors are elected. NO offices, NOR the offices of the secretary and the treasurer shall be combined for any reason.
- (c) The Executive Committee shall have general supervision and control of all activities of the Suring Sportsman's Club.
- (d) Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held when the committee determines it's necessary. (Ref. Article V (b))
- (e) Four members of the Board/Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- (f) Resignation of any officer may be accepted by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Executive Committee.
- (g) A vacancy in the Executive Committee may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Committee. However, if more than one vacancy exists, a special meeting of the club shall be called and new officers shall be elected to fill the vacancies until the date of the next regular/annual meeting provided in Article V, paragraph b.

Article VII – Duties of Officers

- (a) President. The President shall preside at all meetings of the club and at all Executive Committee meetings. The President shall be a member of all regular and special committees, and shall perform all such duties as pertain to the office.
- (b) Vice-President. The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in their absence or at their request.

- (c) Secretary. The Secretary shall notify the members of the Executive Committee of all meetings and shall notify all members of board/special meetings. The secretary shall keep a true record of all meetings of the board/special, committee, and monthly; have custody of all books and papers of the club, except for the Treasurer's books of account, etc.
- (d) Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds of the club and place the same in such bank/banks as are approved by the Executive Committee. Such money shall only be withdrawn by check signed by the Treasurer and for the payment of such bills as shall have been approved by the Executive Committee. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account of all transactions and render a detailed report at every club meeting, a detailed report with vouchers at every Executive Committee meeting, and an annual report to the club at its first annual meeting of each year.
- (e) Range Officer / Ranger Master / Chief Instructor. The Range Officer et al. shall have charge of all small arms instruction, and archery instruction with authority to appoint assistants as needed. The Range Officer et al. shall contract no bills without the authorization of the Executive Committee.

Article VIII – Suspension or Expulsion

- (a) Any officer may be removed by a two-thirds vote of the members in good standing present at any special meeting called for this purpose. No vote on suspension/removal may be taken unless at least fifteen (15) days' notice in writing has been given to the officer of the reasons for their removal and the time and place of the special meeting at which such vote on their removal is to be taken. At such special meeting, the officer shall be given a full hearing.
- (b) Any member may be suspended/expelled from the club for any cause deemed sufficient by the Executive Committee by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the members of the Committee present at any regular/special meeting. No vote on suspension/expulsion may be taken unless at least fifteen (15) days' notice in writing has been given to that member, of the charges preferred, and the time and place of the meeting of the Executive Committee, at which such charges will be considered. At such meeting the member under charges will be accorded a full hearing.
- (c) Charges against any officer/member may be preferred by any member in good standing. They shall be in writing clearly stating the facts relied upon and accompanied by affidavits/exhibits, which are to be used in their support. Such charges shall be filed with the Secretary, who will immediately notify the President. The President will call a meeting of the Executive Committee to hear the charges. The Secretary will give at least fifteen days' notice of the meeting to each member of the Executive Committee and to the accuser and the accused, which notice

shall be in writing and will include a true copy of the charges and of the supporting documents/affidavits and exhibits.

- (d) Any member suspended/expelled by the Executive Committee may appeal to the full membership of the club. Such appeal shall be made in writing to the Secretary who will notify the President. The President will call a special meeting of the club for the purpose of acting on the appeal. The Secretary shall give at least fifteen (15) days' notice in writing to all members in good standing stating the date, time, place and reason for the special meeting. At the meeting of the full club, the Secretary will read the original charges, the supporting documents/affidavits, and will read/display the accompanying exhibits, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Executive Committee at which the charges were heard and action taken. A full hearing will be given the accuser and the accused. A vote will be taken by ballot of the members present and a two-thirds vote shall be required to reverse the action of the Executive Committee.

Article IX – Match Rules

All rifle, revolver, pistol, and archery competitions held by the club will be governed by the rules and regulations laid down by the club.

Article X – Amendments

Any proposed amendments to these bylaws may be introduced by any member of the club at any regular meeting or special meeting called for such purpose. Such proposed amendments may be acted upon by the club members at a regular meeting or special meeting called for the purpose of voting. The Bylaws with amendments/corrections must be read at three (3) separate, regular club meetings before a vote is called. A vote may be called after the 3rd reading at the regular meeting. A two-thirds vote of the members present is required to pass/reject it.

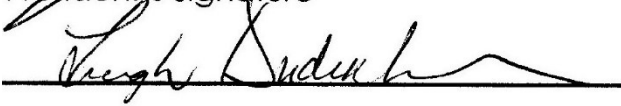
